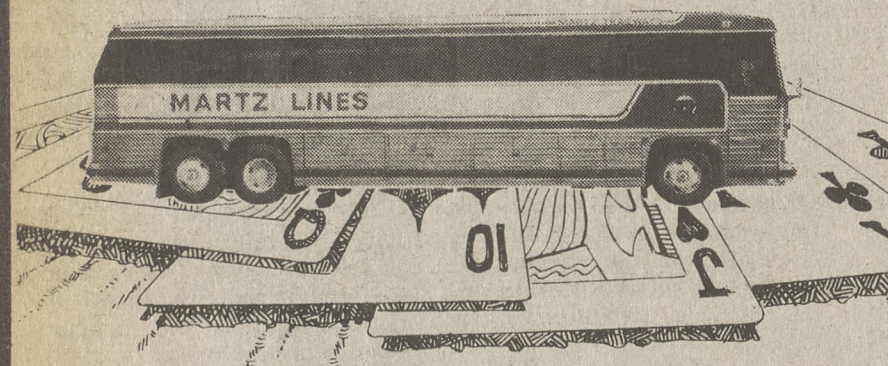
Mrs. Taylor, owner and style director of three area hair and skin care centers, began her career in the Philadelphia area and is a strong advocate on the subject of

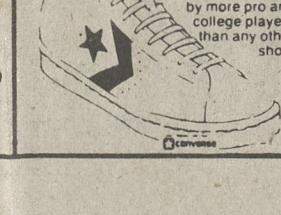
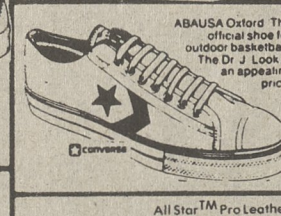
