## 10 seek House seats in May 18 election

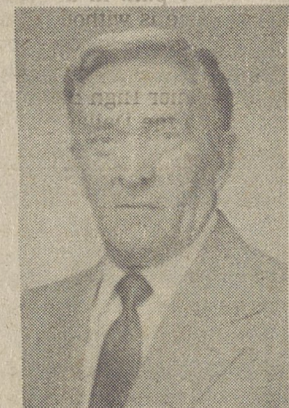
Primary Elections will be held on Tuesday, May 18 and several local candidates will be decided on that day. The big local races involve seats in the General Assembly in Districts 119 and 120, both running through sections of the Back Mountain.

In the 120th District, incumbent Franklin Coslett is seeking his third term as Representative. He is unopposed on his own ticket and will, therefore, be on the November ballot.

Coslett serves as Vice Chairman of the Liquor Control Committee and is on the House Policy Committee, as well as the Professional Licensure and Game and Fisheries Committees. He has been instrumental in the adoption of some key legislation including the blind pension bill, the Veterans Memorial Bridge, updating the Municipal Code and the Cross Valley Expressway. He was part of the sponsorship of 121 bills and one resolution. Democrat Stanley L.



Williams of 94 Walnut St., Kingston is also unopposed. Williams is a retired municipal employee, having served 25 years as a juvenile officer. He is a member of the Masons 395, the Shrine, American Legion, VFW and past president of the Fraternal Order of Police. He is campaigning on the issues of taxes, lack of local jobs and benefits for senior citizens.



In the 119th District where Representative Fred Shupnik is stepping down after a long term of

service, the competition is much fiercer. The Republicans have two candidates to chose from.

Ted Warkowski of Tilbury Terrace is in the race for the second time. Warkowski has been with Metropolitan Life for 30 years. He is a graduate of Wilkes College and served in World War II. He is vice president of the Board of Trustees of the Nanticoke



State Hospital, and past president of the North Mountain Conservation Association. He is also a member of the Greater Nanticoke Chamber of Commerce and the Wyoming Valley Chapter of Life Underwriters.

Warkowski is vitally interested in the problem of escalating health costs, the job picture and high interest rates.

Marie Mera, Green St., Nanticoke is running as a housewife and her particular interest is high utility rates. She is also campaigning against a lack of job opportunities

in Pennsylvania and the general problems associated with inflation.

Marie is a nurse by profession and belongs to the Nanticoke School Guild. She is a committee woman and serves as a fundraiser for the fourth legislative district.



There are six Democrats on the slate, running for a chance to represent the 119th District in the General Assembly.

William Lehman, Jr., of Chapel St., Swoyersville presently serves as a Councilman in that borough. He is a Luzerne County Deputy Coroner and a member of the Board of Directors of the Swoyersville American Legion. He is a Kiwanian, a Catholic War Vet, and belongs to the Knights of Columbus, Slovak League of America, Fraternal Order of Police, and the No. 2 Hose Company in Swoyersville. Owner and operator of the Lehman Funeral Home, he is also a member of the National, State and County Funeral Director's Associations. Stanley J. Jarolin,

Albert J. Wytoshek, E. Union St., Nanticoke is a second term Councilman. An employee of Lions Transportation of Erie, Wytochek also claims membership in the American Legion, Catholic War Vets, Knights of Columbus and the Nanticoke Industrial Development Authority Board. He is a veteran of the Washington Fire Department and affiliated with the local fire company. He is Council's representative to the Department and belongs to the Fire Chief's Association and six County Fireman's Associations.

His primary interests are tax relief, industrial revitalization, increased education and other benefits for volunteer firemen and high utility costs.

He and his wife Delores are the parents of a daughter and have three grandchildren. Other candidates in the race are Jean Ditzler, Hanover St., Nanticoke, Mark Brown, Bridge St., Nanticoke; and Joseph Piazza, Swoyersville.
