Other popular songs sung by the chorus were "Happy Days", the theme song from the popular television show, "Mor-

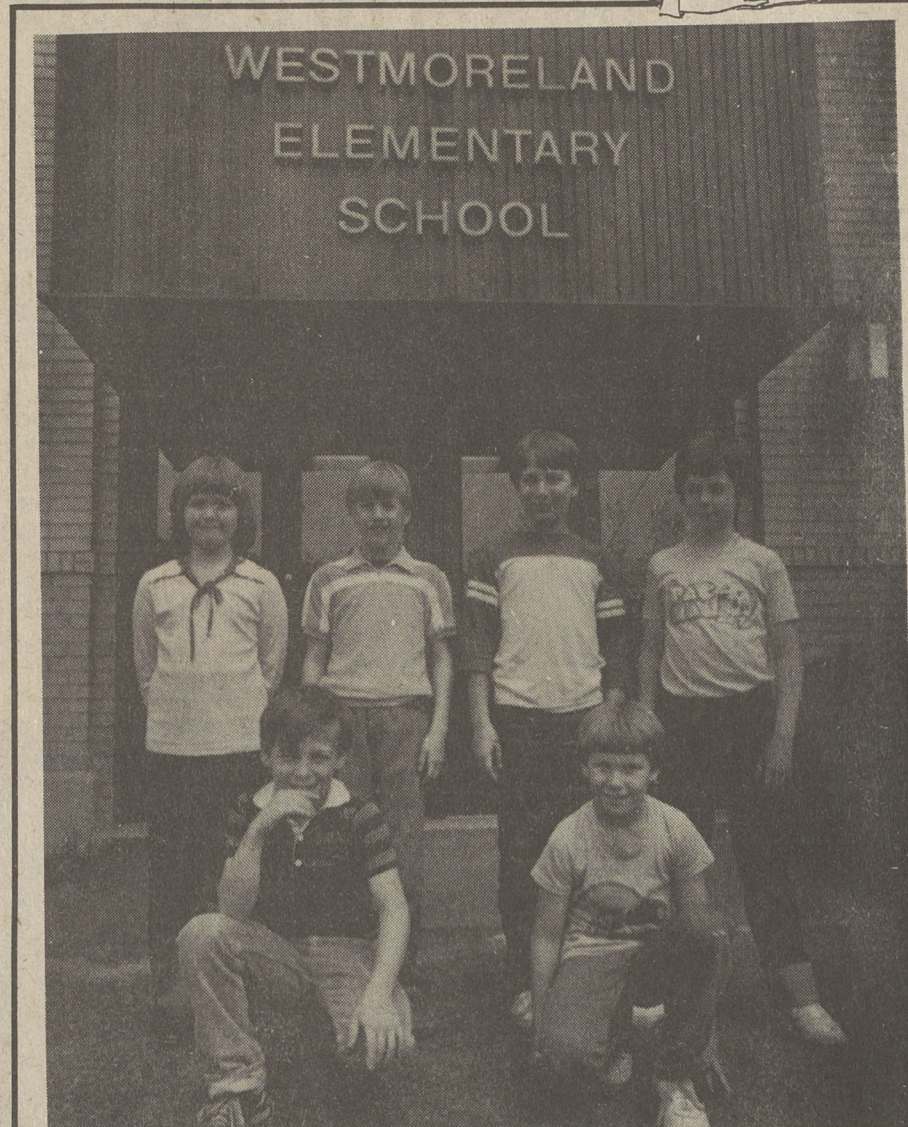
ning Train," "Nine to Five," and "Freebird," all top-forty songs.

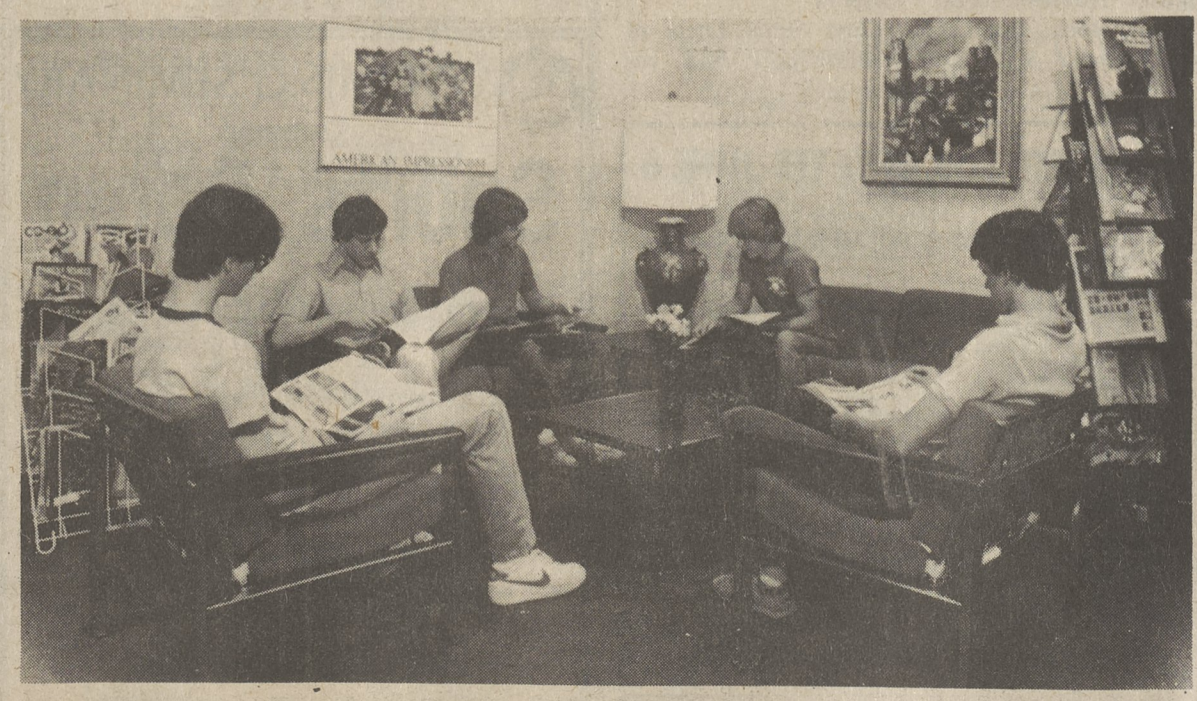
