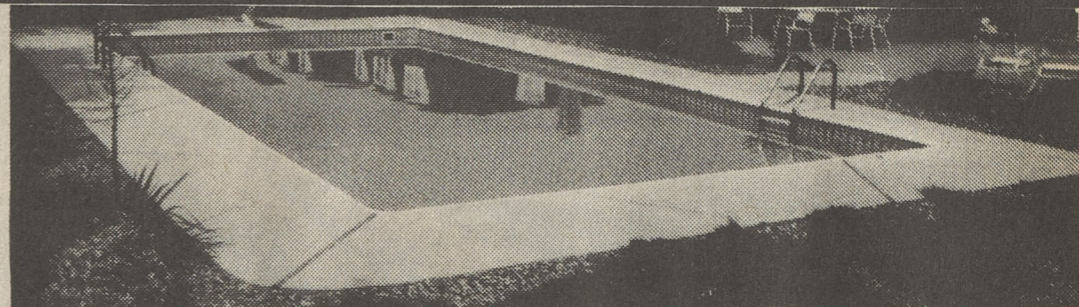
Hanson's Picnic Grounds and Beach are open for the season and anticipate much activity over the July 4 weekend.

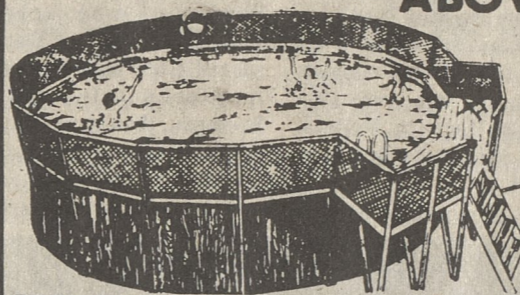
