## POLICE REPORTS

### KINGSTON TOWNSHIP

witness verified her account of the hit and run and said the offending vehicle continued on Carverton Road without stopping. Kingston Township Police Sgt. William Pugh investigated.

There was no injury when a Swoyersville woman failed to heed the

stop sign on Mt. Zion Road and ran broadside into a passing vehicle on Eighth Street, Wyoming last Friday. Skid marks of about 25 feet were noted on Mt. Zion Road. Police were unsure whether Charlotte Mary Pucavage, Shoemaker St., Swoyersville did not stop at the intersection, or

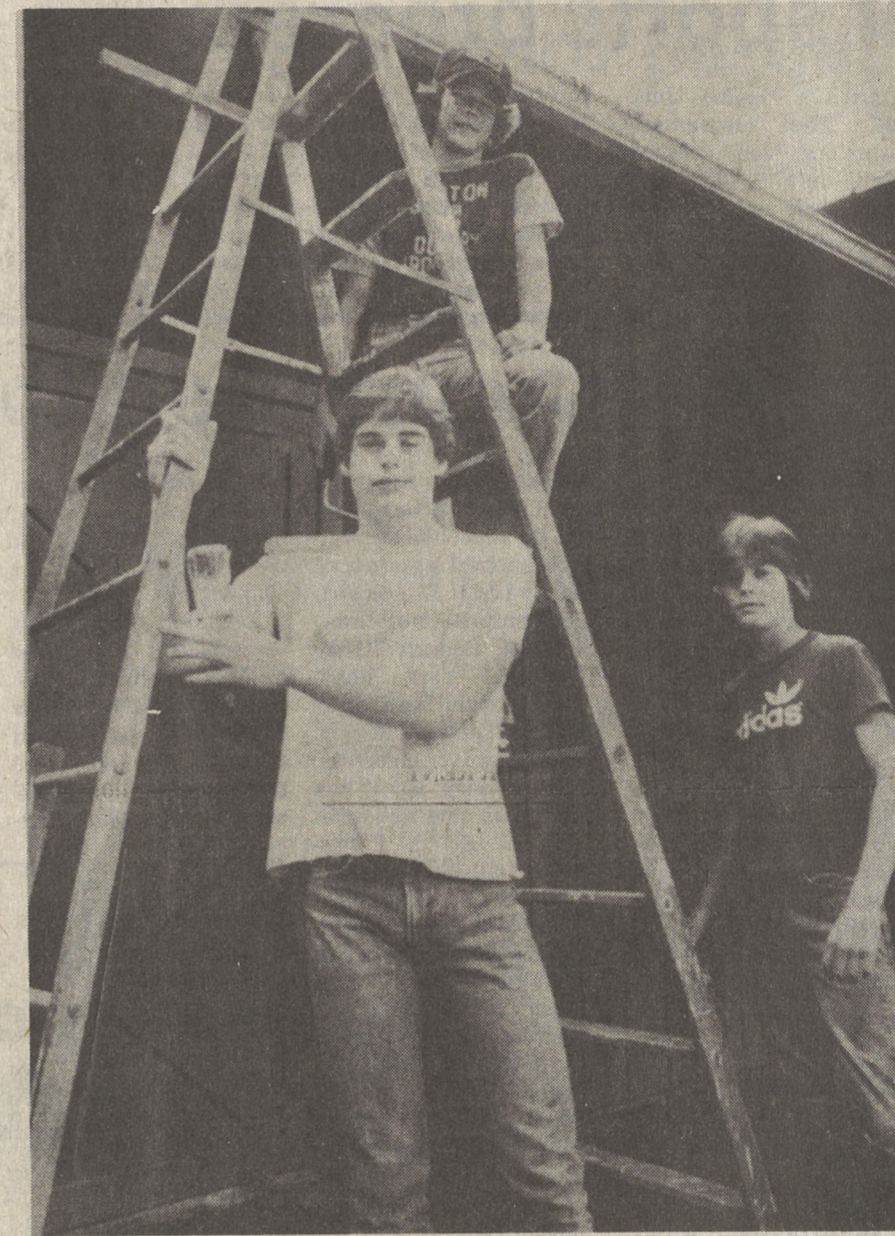
