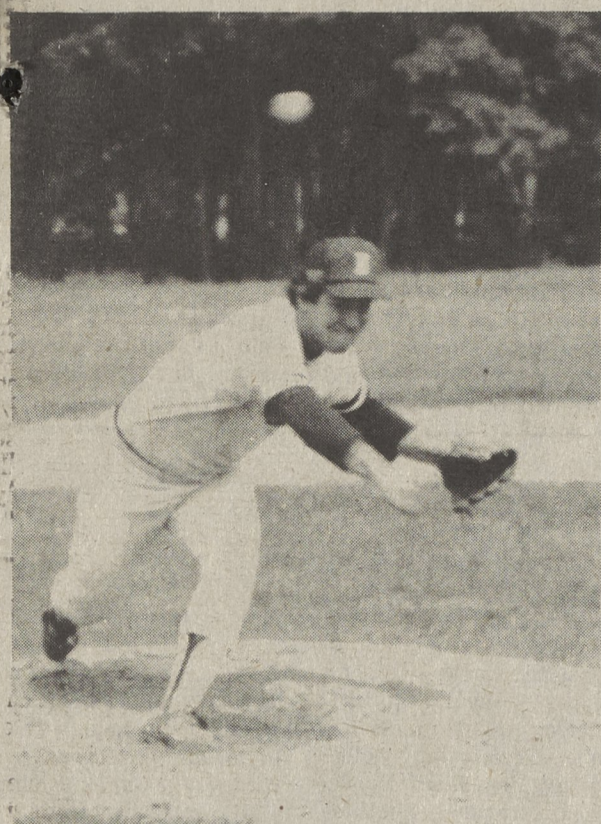

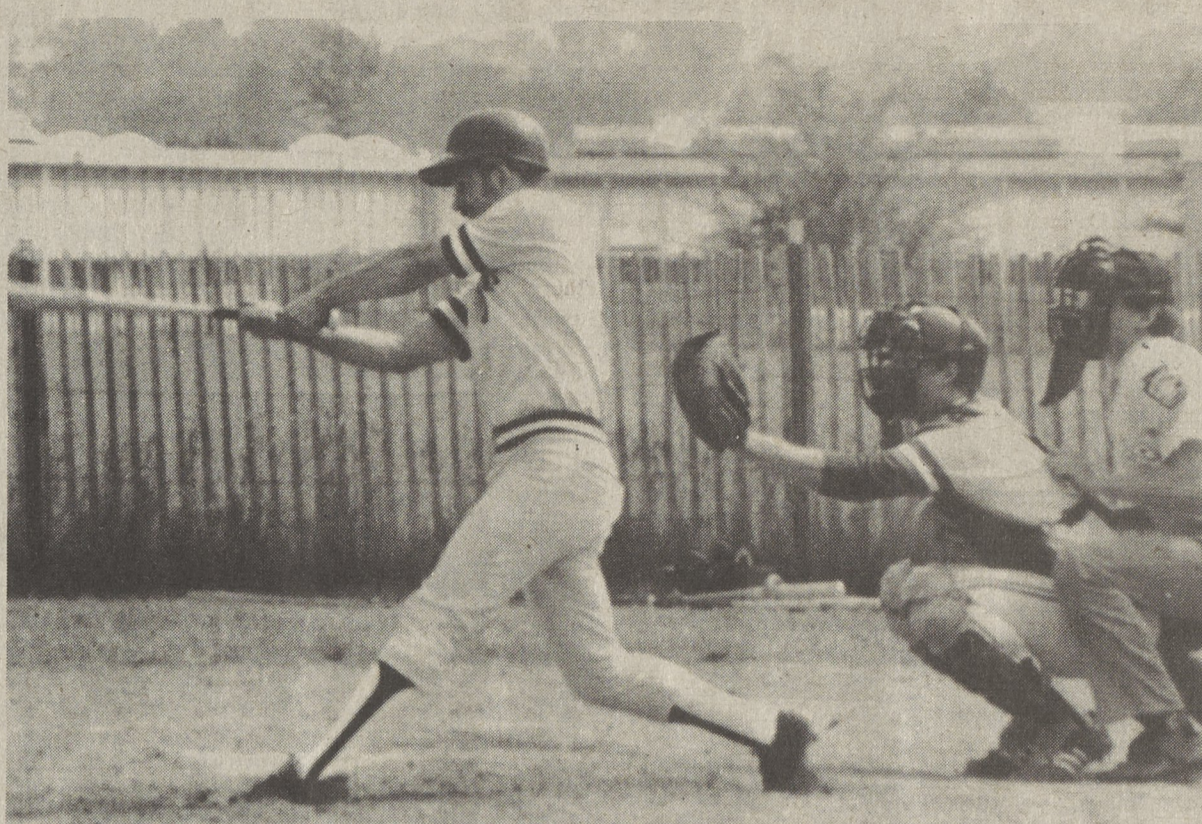

Summer sports program is a success

The summer sports program at Lake-Lehman has met with great success in its second year, according to coaches who were involved. The program included basketball, football and wrestling and

started on Monday, June 21. The elementary wrestling will continue until July 29, but both basketball and flag football concluded last week. Roger Bearde, the school's basketball

mentor, reported elementary basketball attendance at about 45 per day and junior high at 40 per day. The coaches utilized varsity and former school players to help in training the younger athletes.

Specialists were also brought in to give demonstrations and coach the students in the fundamentals of each sport.

"It's work and play," explained Bearde. "It's

not a playground. We work on fundamentals such as ballhandling, footwork and defense. But they get time to compete too, and they like that." All programs were held on school district

facilities. Bearde said most of the boys were returnees from last year, an encouraging sign. "It means they're learning something and want more."

Luzerne County Republican Convention report

Friday evening's Luzerne County Republican Convention at Gus Genetti's Best Western Hotel in Wilkes-Barre promises to be a relatively 'tame' affair, according to an influential party spokesman here in the Back Mountain, as the party makes plans for a united front for the November general election.

Nicholas Marsilio of Conyngham Township, who has served as county chairman of the GOP for the past several years, will be reelected to that post without opposition, the spokesman said, despite rumors to the contrary. An indication of that can be seen in the elections during the past month of district chairmen like Tom Reese of Dallas, who was elected to another term as chairman of the Fifth Legislative District, which includes among other communities, Dallas Borough and Dallas Township, Kingston Township, Franklin and Exeter Townships. Reese, who also is Dallas Borough's tax collector, was reelected without opposition, garnering all 51 votes of the district's committeemen and women, who attended the district convention, in addition to 21 votes of those committeemen and women, who were voted by proxy when they were unable to attend the district convention.

Similar reports came out of the Second Legislative District where Sam Sorber of Hanover Township was elected district GOP chairman. Back Mountain communities of Harveys Lake, Lehman and Lake Townships are included in the makeup of the Second Legislative District.

Jackson Township is included in the Second Legislative District where Ray Sedorchak was reelected district GOP chairman.

At the May primary election, committeemen

and women were elected to serve in those posts for the next two years. They along with district and county officers comprise the district and county governing bodies of their respective parties.
