The story of Frances Slocum lives in all the hearts of those that know about her, those who have a spark of romance left in their souls. The abduction of this little girl and the unfolding tale of her life among the Indians cannot help but capture the imagination of anyone who has even the slightest interest in the beginning of our country and the struggles it entailed. It is therefore most fitting that a State Park be named for this famous little girl, and the cave where she spent her first night as hostage be enclosed within its boundaries. of hiking trails. A beautiful swimming pool is available with a snack bar concession at the pool. The winter time finds areas marked off for sledding and there is 7 miles for snowmobiling. The park offers activities and seclusion to think. walk, or dream.
