

The "basket" is constructed of wire and is laid along areas where washouts are continued maintennance problems. Since unattached stone slips over a period of time, these baskets are filled with gabion stone to form a wall of sorts. The "wall" is placed in layers with the basket portion expected to deterioriate after 40 or 50 years. By that time, PennDOT spokesmen say, enough granular material fills in to compact the stone, essentially, creating a wall. The use of this innovative idea is expected to pay dividends to the borough by reduced situation in the Shoemaker St. ponding area which is fed by the stream on Main St.


