Mohawks squeak by Knights, 8-6

"The breaks didn't go our way. We scored first and ran the ball for two points and missed by about an inch," said Lake-Lehman Football Coach Mark Kirk following their 8-6 loss to Meyers last Saturday.

"I'm real proud of the kids," said Kirk. "They held Meyers offense to less than 100 yards. They outplayed the Mohawks all the way. The kids are beginning to come together and by the end of the season we'll have

some wins under our belt. An important factor is that we don't over-rate nor under-rate our opponents."

Meyers Coach Mickey Gorham admitted his team was lucky to win. The Knights held their opponents to 67 yards rushing and to less than 40 in the air. The Mohawks had only seven first downs in the game.

The statistics prove the Knights played a great game. They had 175 yards rushing and nearly 90

yards in the air. They intercepted two Mohawk passes and piled up 11 first downs.

The difference in the scoring appears to be in the penalties. Meyers had four for a total of 30 yards while the Knights had 10 called for a total of 112. Two of the penalties may have cost the Knights a score.

One was in the third period when Bob Miller intercepted a pass and took it to the two yard

line. But an official called a clipping penalty up field and sent the Knights back into their own territory.

In the final minutes of the game, the Knights had a potential scoring drive on when another major penalty was called cancelling a first down inside the Mohawks 30 yard line and sending Lake-Lehman back past mid-field.

Both scores in the game were in the final five minutes of the first half.

The Knights scored on a 31 yard pass from QB John Williams to Chris Wargo. Que Walczak went for the extra points but was stopped inches from the end zone.

Meyers came back on their possession and drove down field. With less than a minute in the half, Dave Amory hit Ken White with a six yard pass for a score. The Mohawks went ahead 8-6 on Amory's two point pas to Greg Lott.

Hunters warned to protect dogs

The advent of small game season is a month away and Pennsylvania Agriculture Secretary Penrose Hallowell is reminding hunters, "A license is a good way to protect the hunters' companion."

Regular small game season is scheduled to begin Oct. 30, with squirrel and grouse season beginning Oct. 16.

As more hunters enter the fields each year, the number of lost dogs increases. "With a license, we have the means to trace a dog's owner," said Hallowell. "If a hunter finds a stray dog, he should check the license and then contact the County Treasurer's Office."

License fees are only

\$1.20 for males and spayed females and \$2.20 for unsplayed female dogs. They are still available in the County Treasurer's Office in the Courthouse.

Unless absolutely necessary, hunters should be careful to avoid wounding or killing a dog which is chasing game. The hunter is liable for damages unless the dog

was endangering life. If a hunter kills a dog, he must report it to a game protector or the owner within five days.

Hallowell added, "Hunters can avoid problems by understanding the basic dog owner's responsibilities."
