district to submit a viable plan for improving the educational program. The members of the Dallas School District Citizen's Advisory Committee, under the leadership of Dr. Andrew Shaw, have been involved in an intense evaluative process for the past year. The results of their efforts are displayed in the

district's Long Range Plan for School Improvement. This document, which required many hours of research and meetings, will be on display at the Administration Building. Copies of the plan will also be available in each school building in the Dallas School District. All interested persons are invited to review the Long Range Plan for School Improvement at any of the locations.

Formal adoption of this plan is scheduled for the Oct. 11, 1982 Board meeting.

The public will have the opportunity to comment on the plan prior to its approval.

## Career choice tests to be given at Dallas

On Oct. 8, with approval of the Dallas School Board, Dallas juniors will be given the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB). This battery is being given students as part of the students' career counseling program. The results of the test will be used to give the students information on their aptitude for certain job areas. The ASVAB test is a service given to school districts free of cost by the Armed Services. Many high schools across the country have endorsed using this battery as part of their career counseling program.

In addition to the ASVAB, as part of career counseling, during the school year, the juniors at Dallas will also be given an Interest Inventory (VIESA) and they will work individually with the computer-based Guid-

ance Information System. All these sources will be used to help the student match interest and aptitude with current job and job training information. The program is designed to give students as much information as possible to aid in their career choices.

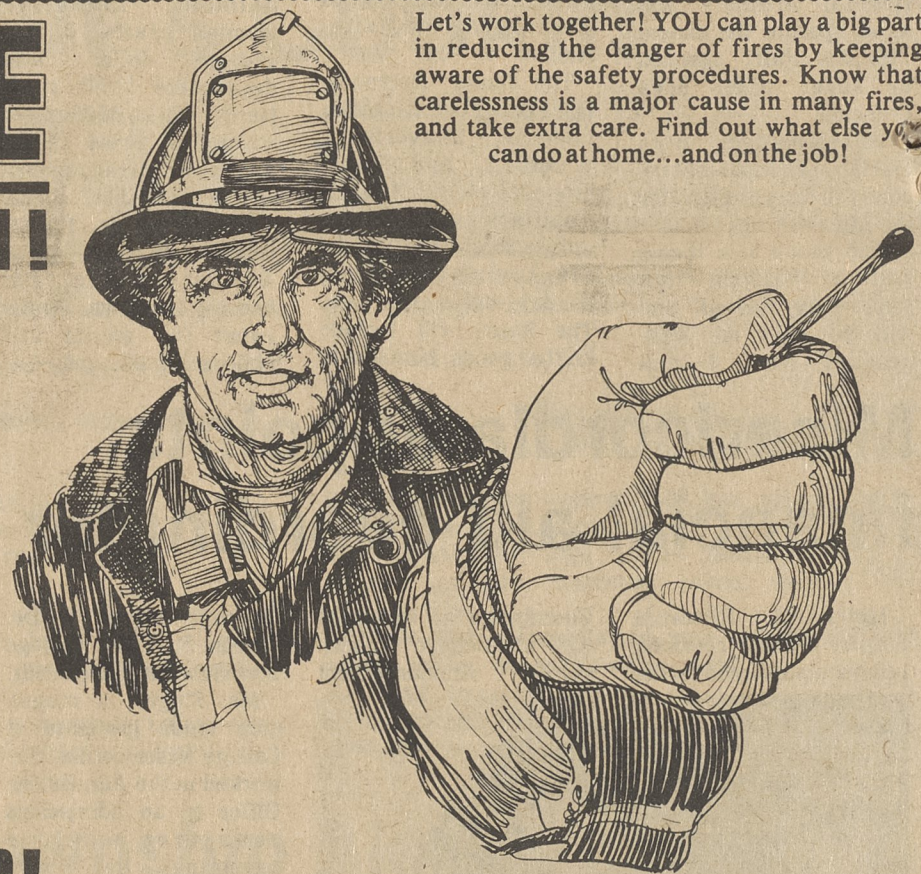
