Mrs. Artiz is secretary to her husband, Atty. Artiz, at his office located on the corner of Owen and Main Streets, Swoyersville. Atty.

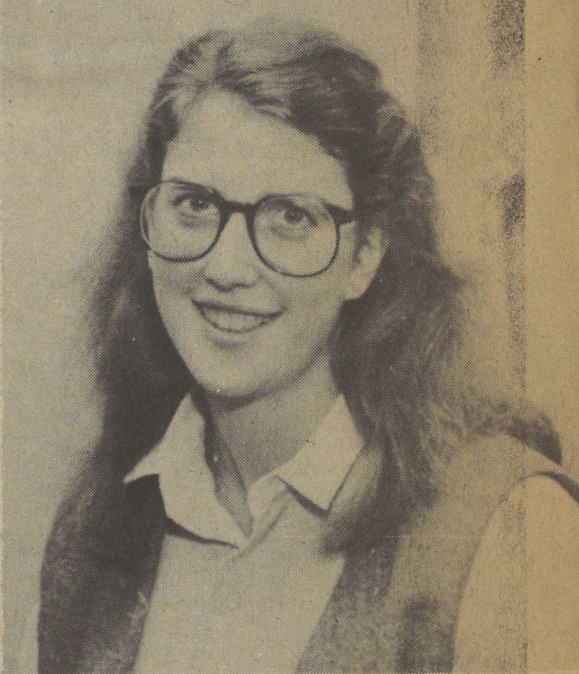
