Mr. Amos is a retired miner.

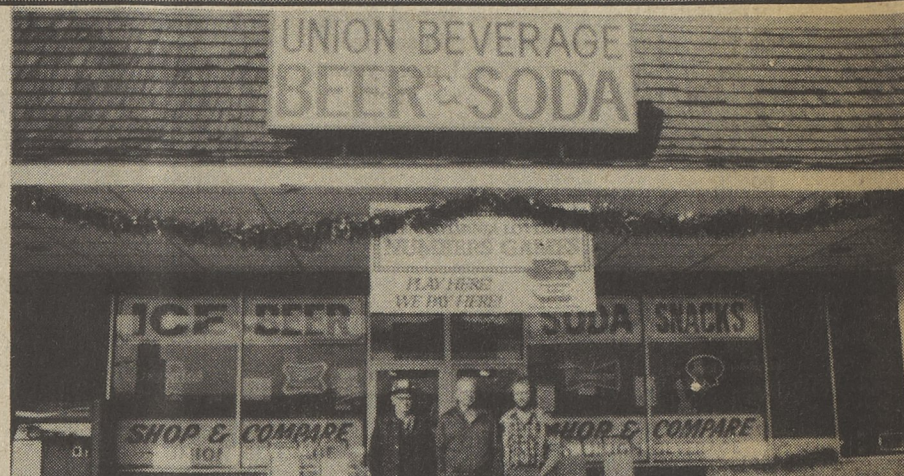
