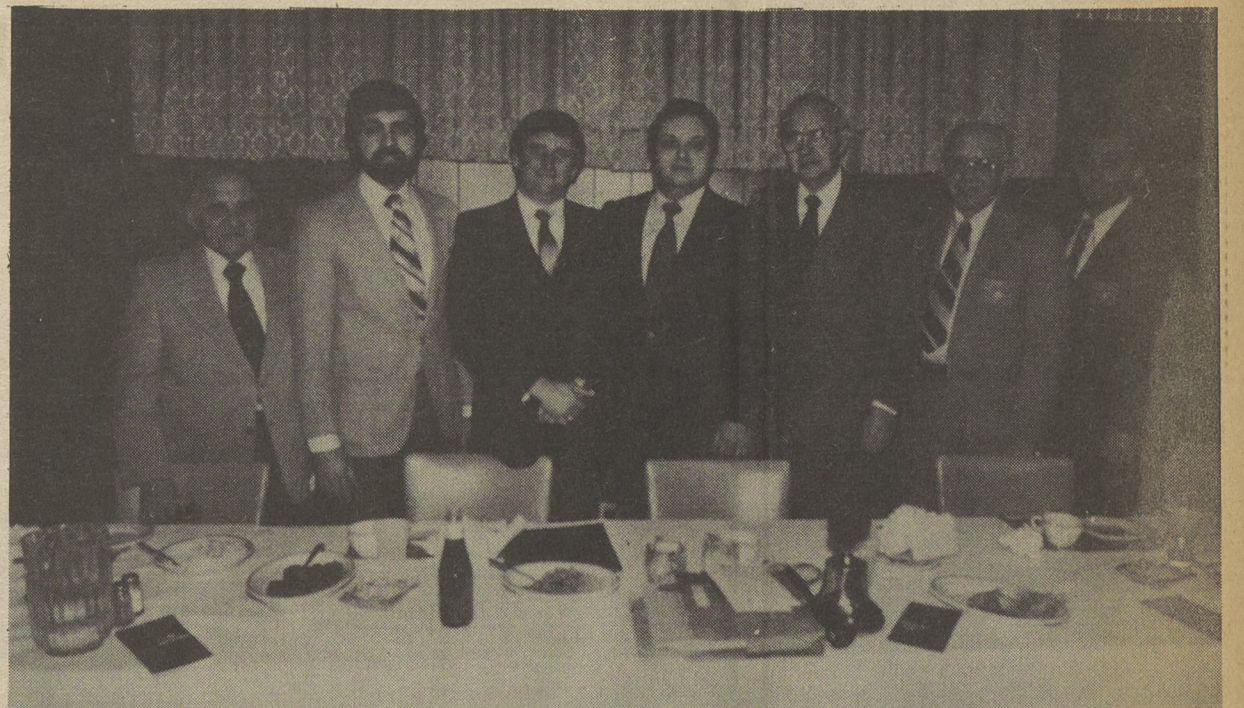

Fishing licenses generous supply

The shipment of 1983 fishing licenses is now complete and over 1700 issuing agents have a generous supply of the new licenses on hand.

This year resident licenses will cost \$12., non-resident \$20, and seven-day tourist licenses will be \$15. Senior licenses

remain at \$2.00 and lifetime resident (available only at county treasurers' offices and from the Fish Com-

mission) are still \$10. Issuing agents receive 25 cents per license in order to cover handling and bonding costs.

Here and There

Garbage stickers for 1983 are available at the office of Luzerne Borough Secretary Marion Cecconi up until Jan. 31, 1983. After Jan. 31, a \$5 penalty will be added to the cost of the stickers.

Sticker costs are \$35 for property owners and \$105 for commercial establishments. Residents who do not purchase stickers will not have their garbage picked up.

Police intend to make a survey of the borough since complaints of some residents indicate that there are people in the borough who are placing their garbage on other people's property. Arrests will be made and a fine imposed on those who are guilty of that practice.

Office hours to buy the stickers are Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 4 p.m. at the borough building.
