### Grant for storm sewers expected

An application for a grant in excess of \$300,000 has been sent to the Department of Community Affairs for Luzerne Borough by its planning engineers. The grant application is being made for a storm sewer project in the Kelly Street area of the municipality.

Residents of the area signed a petition indicating their need for new storm sewers to replace an old box culvert installed many years ago under a Federal work

The box culvert is a walled-in type facility which has created problems in severe storm situations through the

James Suponcec, borough coordinator, sent the petitions to the residents of the area and indicated that the borough would provide storm sewer service for some 400 families if the grant is

Costs are estimated to run about \$285,000 f construction and additional monies would be needed for administra-

The application is being made under the Small Communities Grant administered by the state.

#### Sewer connection fees up


We have had increases in costs for operation and maintenance as well as wage increases for the men, however, nothing to the degree which would
