# **Officials agree: Split division time is due**

With the exception of a few, most school officials recognize that the days of Class AA and Class A schools competing with Class AAA schools for the Wyoming Valley Football Conference title are shortlived

Split divisions, separate AA and AAA Divisions are around the corner the local conference officials better make a major move or be trod upon by those who want their league in order.

WVC president James Nicholas stated that he is willing to try with Scranton or with other playoff. schools to give the local conference equitable

"We could have a two division conference with at least nine teams in each division. This would mean eight games in each division with equitable competition among the teams and two outside


