design purposes, a plain background is better than a cluttered one.

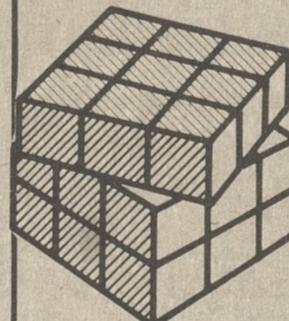
Deadline for submitting photos for our Mother's Day tribute is Tuesday,
