The three, Billy Vigorito, David Davis and Jack Davenport achieved in th six physical fitness tests The series was given to all fourth, fifth and sixth graders at the Lake-Noxen School by physical education instructor,

These include flexed arm hang (girls and pull ups (boys); shuttle run, for throughout the United arm and shoulder strength; standing broad optional in elementary jump, for explosive muscle power in the legs; second year teacher in the 50 yard dash, for speed; Lake-Lehman district, one mile run for endurance and sit-ups, to test efficiency of ab-

dominal muscles.

Vigorito, a fourth grader, did 60 sit-ups in one minute putting him in the 97 percentile; eight pull ups, 93rd percentile; broad jump of 5'8", 85th percentile; 7 minutes 6 seconds mile run, 93rd percentile and 10.0 seconds shuttle run, 95th

percentile. Davis, sixth grader, did 48 sit-ups in one minute, 90th percentile; seven pull-ups, 90th percentile; a 6'5" broad jump, 93rd

percentile; under 6 minutes 20 seconds mile run; 6.9 seconds 50 yard dash, 93rd percentile; and 9.8 seconds shuttle run, 90th percentile.

Davenport did 50 situps, 95th percentile; 9 pull ups, 95th percentile; 6'2" broad jump, 87th percentile; under 6:20 mile run; 7.0 seconds, 50 yard dash; 90th percentile and 9.7 seconds shuttle run, 95th percentile.

The physical fitness program was started in 1957 by President Dwight Eisenhower.
