Borough tax collection rates good

Swoyersville Borough officials last week praised their residents in what Councilman Michael Emershaw was alluding to the tremendous collection rates of taxes, garbage collection fees and the recently enacted sewer use fee.

Based upon information

received at the close of 1982 from the Tax Collector's office and the Borough Coordinator's office, Emershaw related that tax collections were 94 percent, garbage fee collection 98 percent, and Sewer Use Fee collection 96 percent. "These figures," Emershaw

continued," reflect the knowledge of our residents that areas of service by the Borough are supported by these revenues. It is also a reflection on the people's character and their heritage as to paying bills. It is especially encouraging to see such

high percentages of collection in an economy such as this." Emershaw assured the public that the slim minority of delinquents will not be allowed to "slide by" and that the sewer use fee delinquents list will now be taken through the courts.
