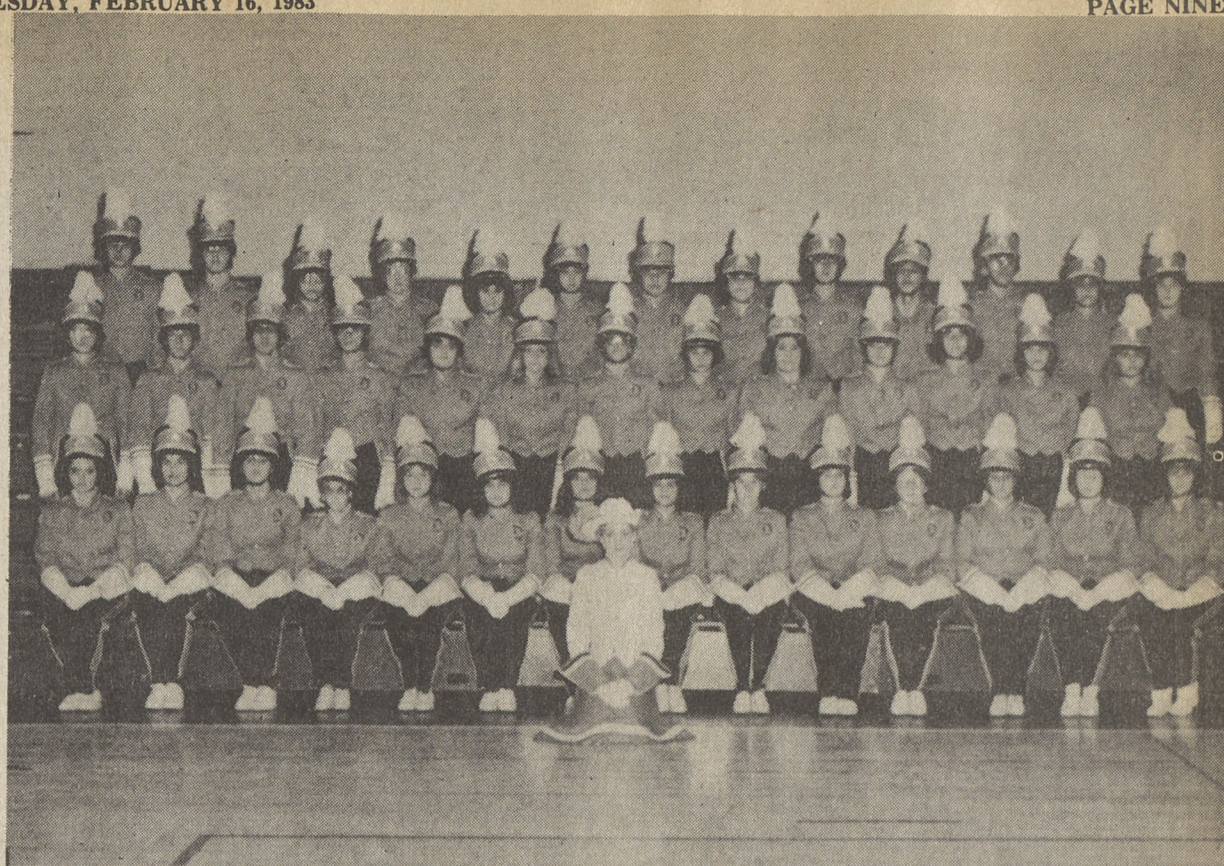

Hosting the District Band Festival is one very big project

Months of planning and hard work will climax this Thursday, Feb. 17, when 60 students from 39 school districts convene in the Dallas Area for the District Band Festival and concert. Dallas Area is hosting the festival for the first time in its history and band director David Benn admits it has been an exhilarating and awesome experience.

Benn has organized a corps of volunteer workers to plan and prepare for the event. The group has been working since November when Dallas' invitation to host the affair was accepted by the Pennsylvania State Music Educators Association. PMEA organizes and sponsors District and Regional Band, chorus and orchestra festivals throughout the state.

Over the months, Benn and his volunteers have found housing for the visiting students, arranged for meals, selected music, hired guest conductor Clyde Barr, purchased medals for the participants, provided for a record company and photographer to record the event, and set up entertainment for the guests.

All of the events including the concert on Saturday, Feb. 19, will be held at the Junior High

School building since more space is available on those premises. Visiting students will be treated to a dance at the school on Friday evening to round off two hard working days of practice. A banquet will be held on Saturday at noon with about 300 administrators, school district directors, students and their guests in attendance.

Participating students were chosen from over 700 who attended tryouts last fall at Montrose Area High School. District winners achieved the highest ratings in solo, sight-reading and scale judging during the all-day competition. Those selected to the first and second chairs of their respective instruments will participate in Regional Band later in the year. Regional Band combines Northeastern and Central Pennsylvania Districts. Tryouts for this honor will be held Thursday at Dallas and will be conducted in much the same manner.

The students will spend about nine hours in rehearsal on Thursday, the day of their arrival in Dallas. Friday will be more of the same. The big day is Saturday, when the young musicians will receive medals for their participation in the District Band at the

banquet. Festivities begin after another morning of rehearsal. The concert, to which the public is invited, begins at 3 p.m. and

will be recorded. Tickets cost \$2.00.

"It's an overwhelming task," explained Benn speaking of the mountains

of details he has plowed through since beginning the planning. "But, it's pretty much under control."

The three-day event is certain to bring recognition to the Dallas School District and the community in general. Major

assistance in arrangements has come from the Dallas Band Parents Association, the administration and entire music

staff. Dallas welcomes its visiting musicians and looks forward to three exciting and rewarding days.

Barr directs Band Festival

Clyde M. Barr will serve as guest band at Dallas this week. Barr received his Bachelor of Science in Music Education degree from West Chester State College and his Master of Music Education degree from Indiana University of Pennsylvania. He is also a graduate of the United States Naval School of Music in Washington D.C.

As Director of Bands for the Carlisle Area School District for 16 years, he developed and directed the World Champion Show Band, the distinguished title his high school band won at the 1970 World Music Competition Festival held in Kerkrade, The Netherlands. Under his leadership, the Carlisle High School Band made two highly successful European concert tours and won six Gold Medals in International Band Competitions. His marching bands, concert

bands and stage bands have received many prestigious awards in competitions at both national and state levels.

Barr is the recipient of commendations and special awards from the Governor and the State House of Representatives. He has also received the "Outstanding Young Men of America Award," the coveted "MAC Award" and Carlisle's most distinguished honor, the "Citizen of the Year Award."

He is tour coordinator and band director of The Sound of America Honor Band and Chorus. The group, comprised of 250 musically talented students selected through audition from throughout the United States. This group makes a three week concert tour of Europe every summer.

This year, Barr is serving on the Board that is heading PMEA's 50th anniversary celebration.
