



Trinisiewski is at odds with the GOP faction headed by Post et al. Trinisiewski, now completing a four year term as county commissioner, has announced his candidacy for a second four year term.

The Post-faction slate, reportedly, will include Michael Yeosock of Plains. Yeosock made an unsuccessful try in 1971 for the job of county treasurer against former County Treasurer William Curwood, Shickshinny. He is well known in county GOP circles and is the nephew of the late Michael A. Yeosock of Plains, who served as county clerk of courts under the old GOP regime under leadership of the late Governor John

GOP county posts include Joseph 'Red' Jones, Lake-Lehman school director, for district attorney.

Mountain area has been prominently mentioned for GOP backing for the post of sheriff. Trinisiewski has settled
