Parents are asked to telephone registrations on school days between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Parents with any questions about kindergarten registration are advised to telephone Miss Stefanko at the administrative office, 288-6551. Children registered for kindergarten will be scheduled for screening at a time and place to be announced. The purpose of the kindergarten screening is to make the child's entrance and transition to school life as smooth and as expeditious as possible. These are the five areas to be screened and those in charge of each screening: Visual screening by team from Wilkes-Barre Association of the Blind; hearing screening by speech therapists of Luzerne Intermediate Unit 18; educational evaluation by Wyoming Valley West school psychologist, elementary guidance counselors, and reading specialists; immunization and health history by Wyoming Valley West school nurses; and gross motor coordination screening by physical education teachers. At the screening, registration will be by the kindergarten teachers. Parents are asked to bring their children's birth certificates and immunization records at the time of the scheduled screenings.

## Registration Set

Holy Trinity School is scheduling registration for students from Kindergarten to Grade 5 on Monday, March 14 and Tuesday, March 15 in the school office on Hughes St., Swoyersville from 9:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. to 2 p.m. Those youngsters entering Kindergarten must be five years old by Sept. 30; first graders, six by the same date.
