A graduate of Swoyersville High School, Ostroskie spent two and a-half years with the Army Engineers in Germany, Austria and Switzerland. After being discharged

from the army, he entered the Pa. State Police Academy on June 16, 1949.

After graduation from the Academy, his first assignment was with Troop "F" at Milton. He was later transferred to Reading where he patrolled the Pennsylvania Turnpike. His next assignment was at Emporium, where he stayed for 17 years.
