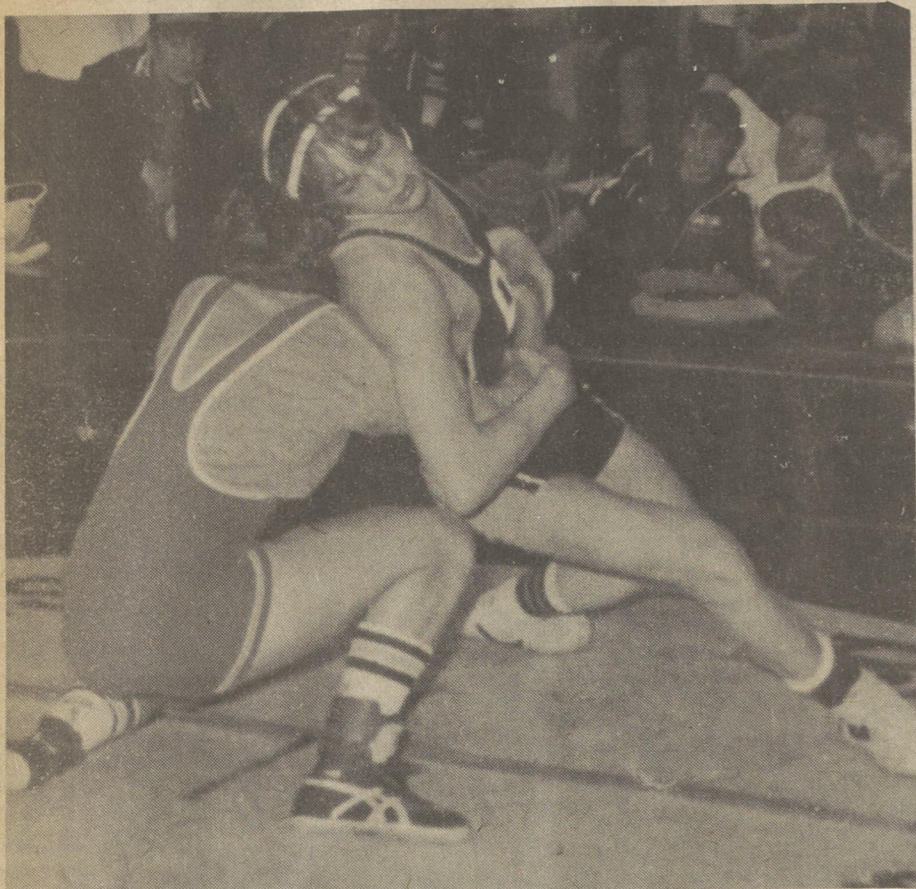

First place winners from Dallas were Carey Falcone, Jeff Hall and Joe Potts. Dave Hislop and T.J. Bagley were fourth place finishers.

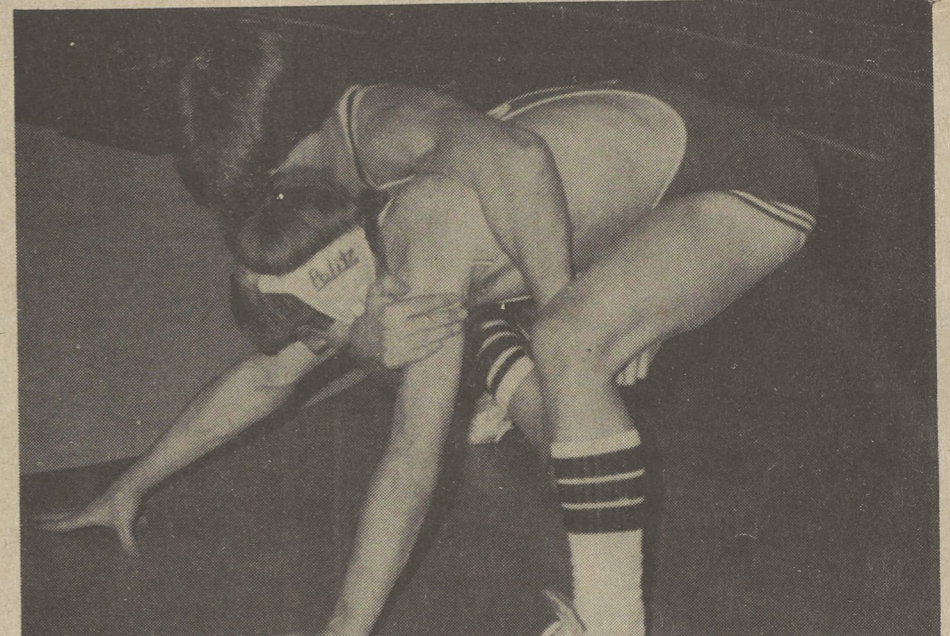

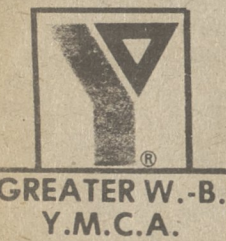
