

# Plans Forming for Lake Fest

The Harveys Lake Homecoming Festival Steering Committee has been meeting regularly to plan a two-day celebration in June. The steering committee is made up of representatives from various community organizations.

The festival, scheduled for Saturday, June 18 and Sunday, June 19, will include a bike race sponsored by Warden Place Association, pro and amateur fishing contests sponsored by the Harveys Lake Bassmasters, an ox (beef) roast sponsored by the Harveys Lake Protective

Association, and a tube race sponsored by Little League parents and scouts.

The Harveys Lake Women's Service Club will hold a dance Saturday night at the Harveys Lake Pub. On both days the borough building and the D.C. Roberts Fire Co.

will be open to the public with exhibits. The fire company will exhibit its equipment while the PA Fish and Game Commission, the Harveys Lake Historical Society, and the Bassmasters will be featured at the borough building.

A variety of events will be scheduled for Sunday, including a sailboat race sponsored by the Harveys Lake Yacht Club, a vehicular parade sponsored by the D.C. Roberts Fire Co., a public motorboat regatta, the Hazleton Ripcords Skydivers Air Show at Hanson's Park, and the Avanti Waterbugs Ski Show.

The festival will end Sunday evening with a fireworks display at Hanson's Park.

All outdoor activities are scheduled weather permitting and the ox roast will provide take out orders upon request. The homecoming promises two fun-filled days at the lake with these events, and, along with the other local restaurants and stands, good food will be in abundance.
