The Meadows Apartments celebrated St. Patrick's Day with a buffet supper.

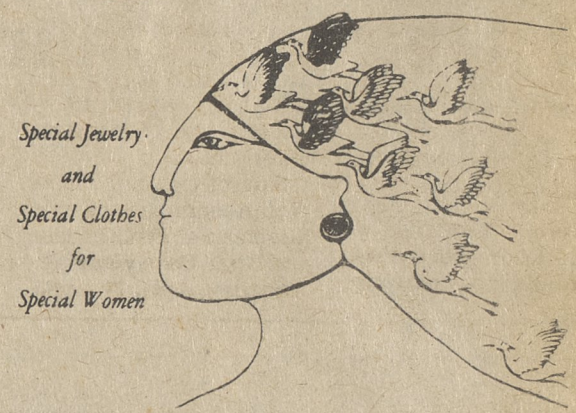
Irish songs were presented by the "Meadowlarks," followed by group singing.
