Pam Solinski playing centerfield batted in three runs, second baseman Sue Bonsavage added two RBI's and shortstop Kim Fey drove in a run. Chris Wasculis also contributed to the Lady Knights scoring with two runs batted in.

### Dallas Girls

Dallas girls' softball players handed Meyers its first loss 19-9 last week behind two home runs by Kathy Walsh, one in the second and the other in the sixth inning.
