The Wilkes-Barre Campus of the Pennsylvania State University will hold its 28th annual commencement exercises on Friday, May 27, 6 p.m., on the lawn adjoining Hayfield House on the Lehman campus. One hundred twenty-four students will receive associate degrees and three will receive bachelor degrees. Five students in the Biomedical Equipment Technology program will receive certificates and will continue their internship this summer for their associate degrees.

Congressman Frank Harrison will be the principal speaker at the graduation ceremony. A resident of Wilkes-Barre, he was elected to represent the

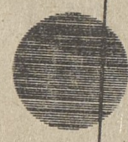
