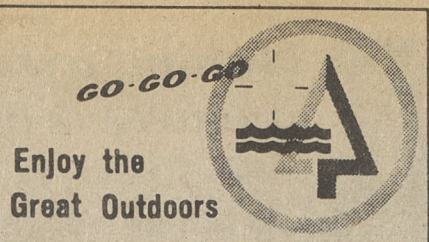
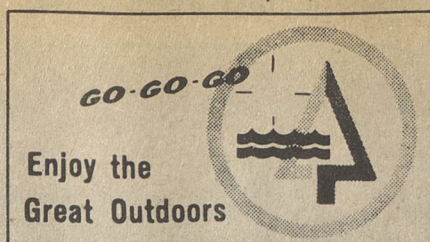

### Boating in safety on area lakes

It's a fact. Most recreational boating accidents occur between 2 and 4 PM on Sunday. (And that doesn't mean you're safe if you launch at 4:30 PM!) Most drownings result from alcohol consumption and most boating accidents are caused by improper look-out and overloading.

Did you know that one ounce of alcohol reduces operator reaction time 25% and in combination with heat, noise and vibration, operator response is reduced another 25%.

The age of the marine operator also bears a relationship to marine accidents. Apparently, the highest risk group is between 25 to 30 years old with 50 to 100 hours of experience.

You need to know how to protect both yourself and others when boating. Do you know how to right an overturned boat? Could you participate in a rescue? The procedure for marine rescue is fairly simple, but the execution is not.

According to the Coast Guard, you should make a return to camp after a morning of fishing? Here's one recommended by Janet

"throwable" or flotation cushion attached to a retrieving line should be thrown to the victim. (It may take two or three tries before the "throwable" comes into reach of the victim.)

To perform this procedure at night you would also need a powerful spotlight on board to help you locate the victim in the water and ascertain his or her condition.

The Q-Beam light manufactured in the U.S. by The Brinkman Corporation has several models with light output equivalent of five to eight times more powerful than your car headlights on high beam. And either the 200,000 or 300,000 candlepower models can be used to spot water hazards, help in locating markers and provide valuable assistance in any emergency after sunset.

These lights are powered by the cigarette lighter receptacle on the boat or can be directly operated from a 12-volt marine battery by pigtail adapters.

Some Q-Beam models offer glare-free lens treatments which prevent glare and reflective bounce-back.

And the condition of all your onboard safety equipment is very important. Have you checked your fire extinguisher lately?

The Coast Guard requires every craft under 16' to maintain onboard personal flotation devices (PFDs) type 1, 2, 3, or 4 (one for every person onboard); a working fire extinguisher, navigation lights, sound producing device (foghorn or whistle) and visual distress signal visible at night.

If your craft is over 16' in length, you also need a visual distress signal for use during day and night.

Having these safety devices onboard and in working condition contributes to both the protection of life and property while boating.

The Coast Guard Auxiliary offers a 12-week certified course in marine safety. Contact the local or district office for information.

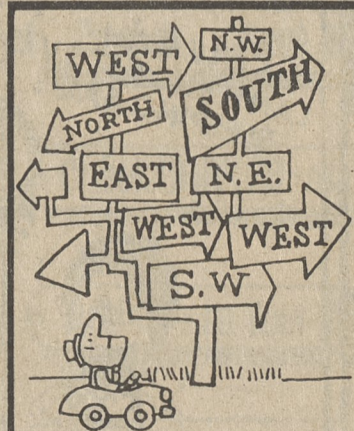

### Car's condition, driver attitude add up to safe vacation tripping

Not many people would venture forth on vacation without having the car or motorhome checked and tuned up. But too few drivers bother to check or tune up their own driving habits.

You get your car's fluid levels checked, all 11 of them. But too many drivers are unaware that one can of beer equals one ounce of 86 proof liquor. Two cans of beer, and you're half-way to being legally considered as under the influence of alcohol.

You get your car's windshields and lights cleaned so you can see—and be seen. But too many drivers wear glasses that are smeared and streaked, restricting their vision.

You get your car's headlights aligned properly so they illuminate the road ahead. But too many drivers fail to use lights properly: to signal stops, to signal turns and to let others see you at night or in dim conditions.

You have your car's tires checked for proper inflation according to manufacturer's

specifications. But too many drivers will take to the road with a bad headache or a slight upset stomach.

Just as you review your itinerary before you set out on a trip, you should review your personal driving habits. A car in absolutely perfect mechanical condition is only as safe as the person driving it.

Remember that motorcycles and bicycles have as much right to the road as the automobile. Give them the respect you would give a truck-trailer rig. A cyclist is entitled to a full traffic lane; don't try to share the lane with him or crowd him off the road.

In city traffic, you will possibly see bicycles being ridden against traffic—contrary to the rules which say bicycles should go with traffic. Keep your emotions under control and proceed with caution. An angry driver is unsafe at any speed.

In residential areas and camp sites, you must keep all your senses alert for children, small animals, bouncing balls,

and even unthinking adults who may calmly stroll into roadways.

When driving, be sure to keep a "safety cushion" between your car and the one ahead. At 55 MPH, it takes more than 200 feet to react to a problem and brake to a stop.

Follow the two-second rule. When the vehicle ahead of you passes a stationary object (a post or a bridge), count to yourself, "one thousand and one, one thousand and two." If you reach the object before you finish the count, you're following too close to the vehicle ahead.

If you're being tailgated, slow down and encourage the car behind to pass you.

If a car intrudes between you and the car ahead, drop back to give yourself two seconds behind the new car. If the weather is bad, give yourself more time.

Remember, a vacation or long weekend should be fun. Proper car maintenance combined with proper driver behavior will get you where you're going in a happy mood.
