Out-going president Mimi Koch turned the gavel over to new president Kathy Greger, and the following new officers were installed: Judy Cetei, first vice president;

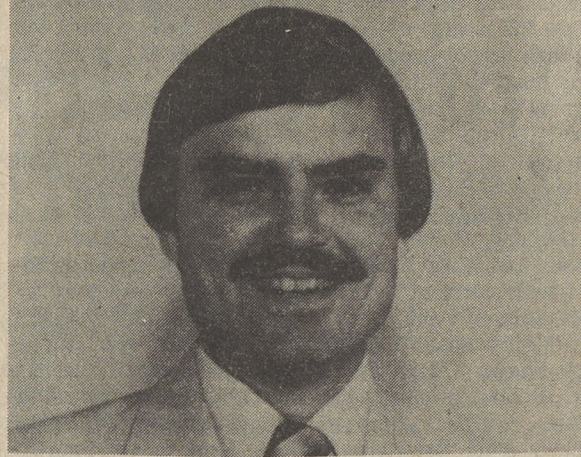
Susan Healey, second vice president; Sandra Murray, treasurer; and Patty O'Neill, secretary.
