Jay May

Plays Major Role in New Fields

Jay May, chairman of the Land Acquisition Committee for the Back Mountain Little League, is playing a major role in helping to find a new home for future Back Mountain baseball players.

The Dallas Post recently reported the Land Acquisition Committee has found a "Future Home" in a piece of land behind the Dallas Senior High School. The discovery of this piece of land culminated a year-long search by the Committee which sought a field which would meet the increased standards of the Little League Organization in Williamsport.

"It seems amazing that such a rural area does not have more land available," said May. "The only other place available was the Fall Fair Grounds but that sight was so sloping, it was not practical." May explained the cost of preparing the Fall Fair Grounds would have been so exorbitant, it would be impossible for the Little League Organization to acquire the necessary funding.

The land behind the senior high school has been "on offer" for about

four months and the intention of the Little League officials now is to begin work on it as soon as possible. May's part in the fall when they begin work to alleviate rough grading and a drainage problem on the land.

The forming of a legal association in order to obtain federal grants has been done and four municipalities have approached Attorneys Townsend and Jones to request the funds. Officials from the municipalities involved - Dallas Township, Dallas Borough, Kingston Township and Lehman Township, hope the legal transactions will take place in 30 to 60 days.

May, who coaches the Dodgers in the Back Mountain Little League Majors Division and who has an 11-year old son playing in the organization, feels there has been a lot of cooperation in acquiring suitable land.

"All along, we have had super cooperation from everyone - the school directors, the township supervisors, and the borough councilman," May said.

LEGION LOSES
