## L-L Band Garners Award

Victory is nothing new for the award-winning Lake-Lehman High School Band. Directed by John Miliauskas, it climaxed its 1982-83 competition season recently with a big win in Sherburne, N.Y. at the 34th Annual Pageant of Bands.

Three first place trophies for Parade, Field Show and Field Drum Major as well as a second place trophy for Indoor Color Guard were added to the already bulging trophy cases at the Lake-Lehman High School. John Headman is Drum Major. Forty one bands participated in the all-day event.

This outstanding marching unit totaled 49 trophies just this season with 42 of the 49 being first place awards.

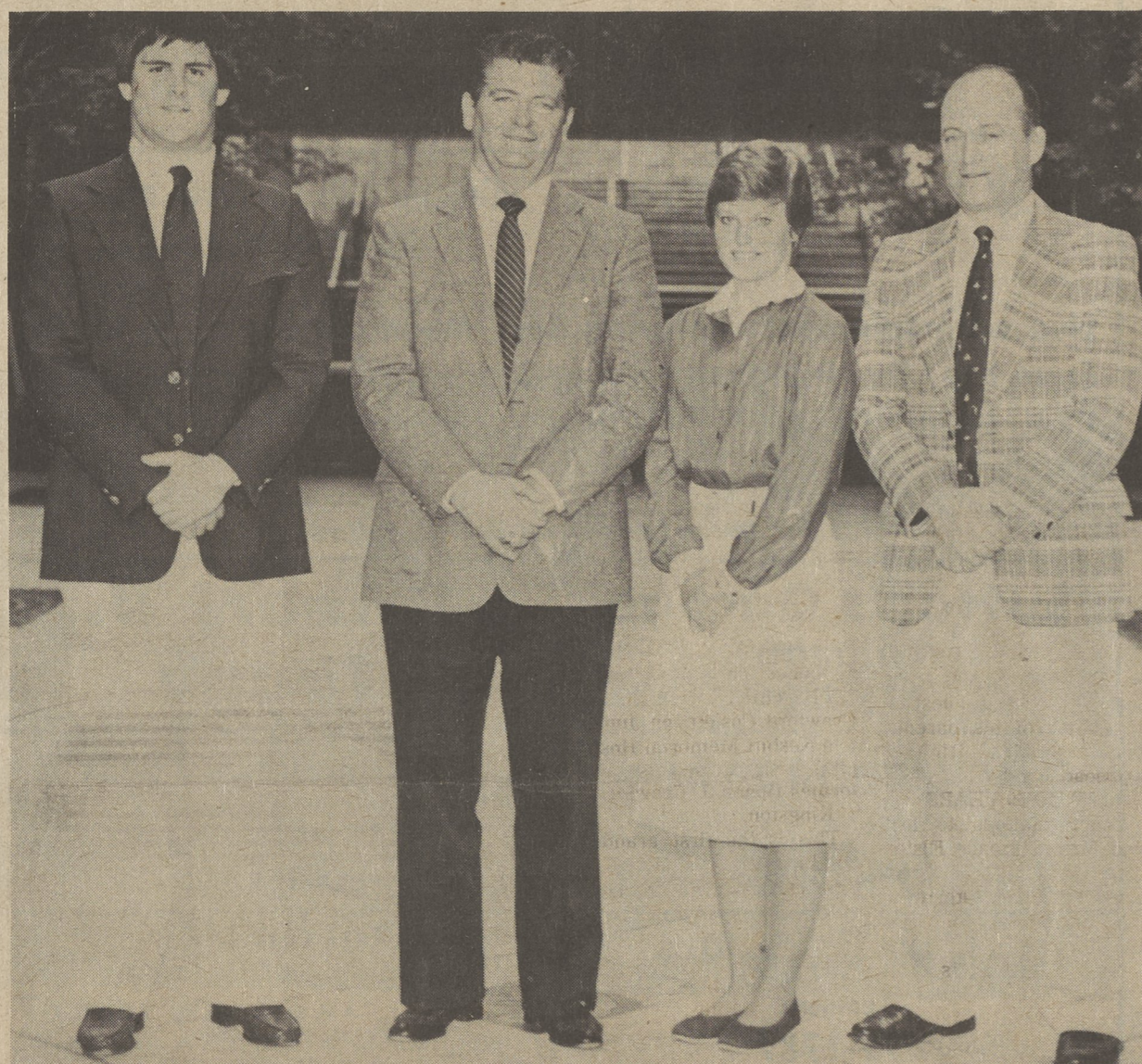
The staff also helped with the selection of proper materials. All the materials needed to complete the projects were provided by the school district. The projects were made and taken home, ready for immediate use.
