For weeks now, motorists driving through the center of town have been watching the "Desert Over Dallas" being painted on the top wall of a building facing the Memo-

The building is "The Recyclery" on Main Street owned by Hugh King who originated the idea for beautifying his blank wall, made a sketch and then turned the project over to a talented young artist.

That artist is 19-year-old Wendy Morgan of Windsor Drive, Orchard View Terrace, Dallas who you have seen perched on the scaffold whenever the weather permits. First, she painted the sky and the paved road crossing the desert to the mountains and next will come cactus and other

desert plants in the foreground of the large mural.

A 1982 graduate of Dallas Senior High School, Wendy is presently a Fine Arts major at Penn State University's Main Campus. A talented artist, she has studied locally with Sue Hand where some of her works have been exhibitied. Other works of hers are currently being shown in Penn State exhibits and in the Rossetti Memorial Show

When she climbs down from her perch high above Dallas which Wendy describes as "really very hot in the early afternoon", she will be leaving a unique gift to area residents. Years from now when Wendy has graduated from the university and gone on in her career in museum or gallery work, the "Desert Over Dallas" will still be there for all of us to admire.
