Consultant **Presents Talk** at Marywood

Career consultant Jacqueline Norton Bendick will present a career workshop Aug. 1, 2 and 3 from 9-11 a.m. at Marywood College.

Bendick's presentation, entitled "Considerations and Techniques Associated with the Career Process," is part of the Celebration of wholeness, Aug. 1-5, sponsored by the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and Marywood.

Bendick is a Marywood alumnus now living in Manhasset, N.Y. During her three-day workshop, she will focus on assessing skills, exploring the job market, resume writing, and interviewing techniques.

Bendick's workshop is one of several offerings included in the week-long Celebration of Wholeness, designed to provide an integrated program of activities geared to the physical, mental and spiritual components of wholeness


Marywood **Slates Exams**
