She's dedicated to sports

Her blue eyes sparkle and her face lights up with enthusiasm when she discusses softball or field hockey

"I don't know which way I'll go in the future," said Kelly Wandel, an attractive Lake-Lehman sophomore. "I really love softball because it is so competitive but I also enjoy playing field hockey. I just haven't played it as many years as I have softball.

Kelly started playing softball when she was nine years old. She wanted to compete against boys on a hardball team but, at that time, the Little League wouldn't allow girls to become playing members of a hardball team. Not to be denied her favorite sport, Kelly tried out for softball and has played every season since, in summer leagues and when old enough on the school team.

She has been a member of the Back Mountain Baseball Girls All-Star teams for four of the past five years. With the exception of several occasions, Kelly has played the shortstop position.

This year she was a spark plug in the Division II All-Star team which advanced to the state competition and placed third in the state. It is the first time since 1980 that a Back Mountain team has made it to the state playoffs.

Kelly suffered a knee injury in one of those two final games when a girl on the opposing team slid into her leg while trying to steal second. The impact twisted Kelly's knee and sprained some tendons. That injury may prevent her from getting in to the starting lineup on this year's high school field hockey team. She is hoping to be an offense linemen or a back. Last season, as a freshman, Kelly lettered in field hockey playing as a sweeper.

Kelly likes to compete against boys in athletic programs and one year wrote a paper about girls and boys participating on the same team.

To-date, softball is her first love and Kelly gives her father all the credit for helping her. From the time she was eight years old, he spent many hours teaching her how to catch and bat. As the only girl in the family, Kelly developed her interest in sports by playing baseball and softball with her dad and her uncles

Prior to the first All-Star game this season, Kelly remembers that under the direction of Mrs. Charlotte Slocum, the team members practiced a total of about 32 hours

"She's a great coach," said Kelly. "This season is the second time I have been on the team when she was the coach. She is dedicated and transfers her enthusiasm to the girls.'

In her freshman year at Lake-Lehman, Kelly lettered in softball when the team was coached by Florence Finn

"A lot of us will be back this year," said Kelly, "and we should have a strong softball team. I plan to attend college when I graduate from high school and hope to earn either a softball or field hockey scholarship. I want to major in some area of sports, such as a trainer."

An honor student in school, Kelly also has the qualities needed for leadership and there is no doubt these will serve her well in her goals for higher education. She has that rare combination of humility, sincerity, compassion, enthusiasm and persistence which builds into strong leadership. People will be sitting up to take notice of Kelly Wandel in the years ahead


According to Ray Hillman, past president of the Back Mountain Medical Center, the free physical examinations were conducted for players and cheerleaders.
