To date, the jailing of first time offenders has seemed to be the exception rather than the rule. Most judges sitting in the Court of Common Pleas have decided in a large percentage of cases to place first offenders in A.R.D. programs (Accelerated Rehabilitative Disposition), although the record of their arrest remains current for a
