During his 41 years of professional performing, Albacker has accumulated quite a list of credits. Magician Albacker also performed seven times in one year at the White House for the Kennedy children. At present, he is the official magician for Walt Disney World in Orlando, Fla. and is performing in "The Magical World of Walt Disney" which he authored.

Aside from his professional performances, Harry makes regular visits to cheer accident victims and VA hospital patients with his "Magic Mania." Making people happy is what has kept Harry roaming the world dazzling crowds since the age of 11.
