Meanwhile, state police from the Tunkhannock sub-station are continuing the investigation and all area farmers, who have cattle on their farms, have their guns loaded just in case!

Hot air balloon returns

Doug Lane will be flying his big hot air balloon "Sunkiss" at the Luzerne County Fair on Wednesday, Sept. 7, Friday, Sept. 9 and Sunday, Sept. 11 beginning each evening at about 6 p.m.

Doug recently flew "Sunkiss" during the official bicentennial celebration of manned flight in Annonay, France. He was one of six American balloonists representing the United States in the world wide event recognizing the first flight of a balloon in 1783.

"Sunkiss" is a colorful orange, red, and yellow balloon that stands 8 stories high and contains 80,000 cu. ft. of air. Tether rides will be available to visitors at the fair for \$5.00 per person on a first come basis, weather and winds permitting. Riders will get a spectacular

view of the fair.

Doug Lane holds a commercial pilots license for balloons and has flown "Sunkiss" throughout many states and in France. He is the owner of Radio Stations WWDL-Stereo 104 and WICK-AM 14 in Scranton, and his familiar voice is heard on commercials on radio and TV stations in Pennsylvania and New York when not ballooning.

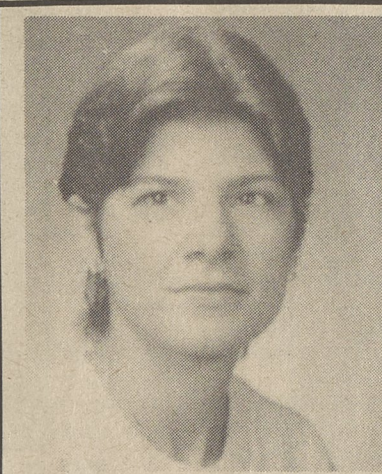

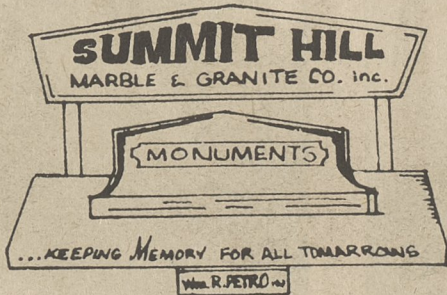
