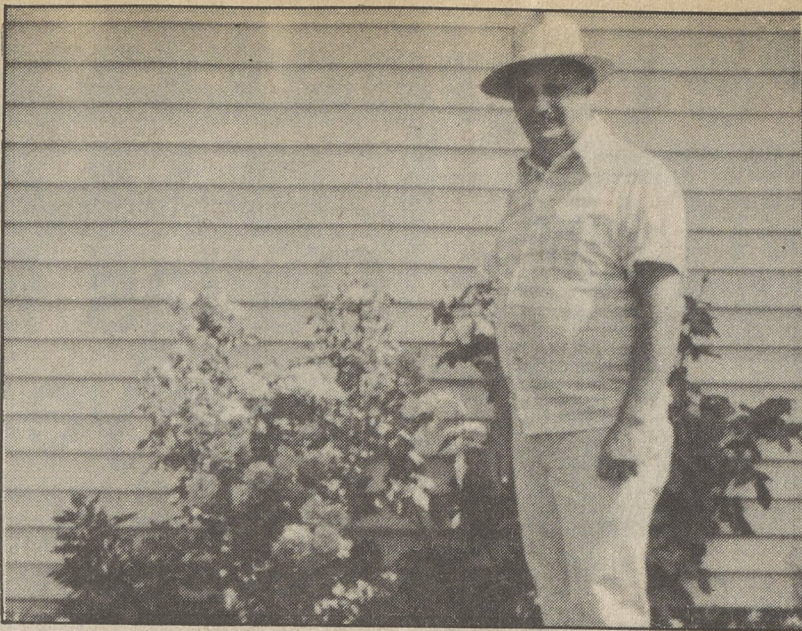

TOWNSHIP ROAD DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES last week began installing sewer drain pipe on Lewis Road, near Memorial Shrine Cemetery, preparatory to getting the road in shape for some anticipated paving. Franklin Township supervisors recently received a grant of \$50,000 from the Luzerne County Office for Community Development, and the moving, it was announced, will be used to improve Lewis Road and Village Road, both of which have been in poor shape for several years.
