Offset granted loan

Council adopts ordinance

The Harveys Lake Borough Council unanimously adopted an anti-pornography ordinance at a meeting held Sept. 20.

The ordinance prohibits the commercial exploitation of obscene films, publications, devices, articles or instruments and the use of massage parlors or model studios for the purposes of lewdness, assignation or prostitution.

It also bars the selling, lending, distribution and exhibition of any obscene films, publications, devices, articles or instruments. It also prohibits the advertisement of obscene or pornographic material.

Policemen hire lawyer

Dallas Borough Council received notice Sept. 20 that three full-time police officers of the borough have hired a lawyer to represent them in possible arbitration proceedings concerning a contract dispute.

The council has hired Attorney Charles Lemmond to represent it in the binding arbitration.

The police officers, Severn Newberry, John Fowler and James Tupper have agreed to meet with council representatives once more before entering arbitration.

The officers have altered their original proposal and are now requesting a \$1,000 across-the-board raise, a \$50 increase in holiday pay and a \$25 increase in clothing allowance.

Township police agree

Dallas Township supervisors and policemen have reached an agreement on a new two year contract which was signed Sept. 13. The officers will receive a five percent across-the-board raise for 1984 and a six percent increase in 1985.

Also included in the new contract was a \$100 increase in the \$300 holiday pay, continued payment for Blue Cross-Blue Shield premiums and an insurance policy that will pay a police officer's widow half the officer's allotted retirement pension.

Offset Paperback Manufacturers, Inc., a Dallas-based printer of paperback books, has received a \$935,000 loan from the Luzerne County Board of Commissioners for business expansion efforts.

The commissioners approved eight business development loans at

their Sept. 21 meeting, thus increasing the total assistance provided for business expansion efforts in the county by an additional \$2,994,576.

Of the loans approved in this funding round, it is estimated that 255 permanent full-time jobs will be

created, 159 existing jobs retained, and 93 temporary construction jobs created.

Offset Paperback proposes to renovate its Dallas plant, as well as purchase equipment and machinery for installation in the facility. The project, which requires \$1,610,000 will lead to the creation of 33 full-time jobs over a three-year period, as well as 35 temporary construction jobs.

Lake Lehman receives grant

The Lake-Lehman School District has received a \$1,434 grant from the Department of Environmental Resources for the operation of a sewage treatment plant, it was announced recently by Rep. George C. Hasay.

Lake-Lehman was among five local organizations receiving \$182,000 from the DER of the operation of such plants. Hasay noted that DER has awarded \$9.1 million in similar grants to 877 local governments throughout Pennsylvania.

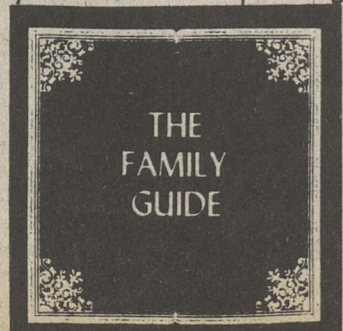
