County libraries seek additional funds

A meeting of representatives of the Luzerne County libraries was held recently at the Osterhout Free Library, 71 S. Franklin St., Wilkes-Barre.

The libraries convened to discuss county appropriations for public libraries for the 1984 year. A meeting where the libraries could explain their funding needs to the

Luzerne County Commissioners is hoped for in the near future.

Presently, many of the libraries do not meet state minimum standards. If these standards are not met, the libraries will not qualify for state aid. All libraries need additional staff and volumes. All libraries suffer from tremendous increases in operating costs. This is

particularly true in the area of library materials. A relatively short murder mystery now costs \$12.95 and a work of non-fiction is frequently \$19.95.

The libraries will explain to the commissioners that an increase in library appropriations from the county is essential for the public libraries to continue to serve residents of the county.
