

THE ORIGINS OF HALLOWEEN

In ancient Britain the Celts celebrated an autumn festival called 'Samhain', a festival that, over time, took on a spooky significance involving ghosts, witches, and so on. When Christians began celebrating All Saints Day on November 1, they also observed the evening before - All Hallow E'en - as a holy or hallowed time. Gradually, All Hallow E'en - or 'Hallowe'en' - became a secular observance that combined the old customs of Samhain with games and occasional mischief-making.

UGI will read meters twice a month

In a move to further reduce its operating expenses and minimize the need for higher rates, the Luzerne Electric Division of UGI Corp. has said it will return to reading its customers' meters on a bi-monthly basis this fall.

The changeover from monthly readings, together with related work force reductions and other cost reduction measures, will result in annual savings of approximately \$120,000 according to Fred Hartwig-

sen, UGI's manager of consumer relations.

"We will begin reading all residential meters and those of small commercial customers every other month, starting Nov. 1," Hartwigsen said, "but we will continue to mail monthly bills to all customers."

UGI has been reading meters every month since 1975 when the utility's monthly fuel adjustment charges applied to each kilowatt-hour used varied widely.



Director of Church Council lists events

The Rev. Anita J. Ambrose, Executive Director of the Wyoming Valley Council of Churches announces the following for the Clergy of Wyoming Valley.

Quality of Life in a Hurting world is the theme of the 1983 Pennsylvania State Pastor's Conference. It will be held Nov. 14-16 at Penn Harris Motor Inn, Camp Hill. Mortimer Arias, Colin Morris, Bishop John Hurst Adams, Jill Briscoe, Joan Martin and Manfred Brauch are among the featured speakers. Arthur L. Brandenburg, Executive Director, West Philadelphia Fund for Human Development, and Pastor of Calvary United Methodist Church, will be Chaplain.

Other leaders include: Myron R. Chartier, Professor of Ministry and Director of Doctoral Programs, Eastern Baptist Seminary; David A. Dorsey, Assistant professor of Old Testament, Evangelical School of Theology (Myerstown) and an experienced archaeologist; Paul D.

Gehris-Director, Office of Social Ministry, Pennsylvania Council of Churches, and manages Pennsylvania IMPACT.

Chairman of the Conference Planning Committee is Rev. Dr. Norman B. Bucher, Jr., Area Conference Minister, Penn Central Conference, United Church of Christ. "The 1983 Conference continues our tradition of a world-class event of continuing education and inspiration for our

pastors," said Dr. Bucher. "An added benefit is the opportunity to form inter-denominational friendships."
