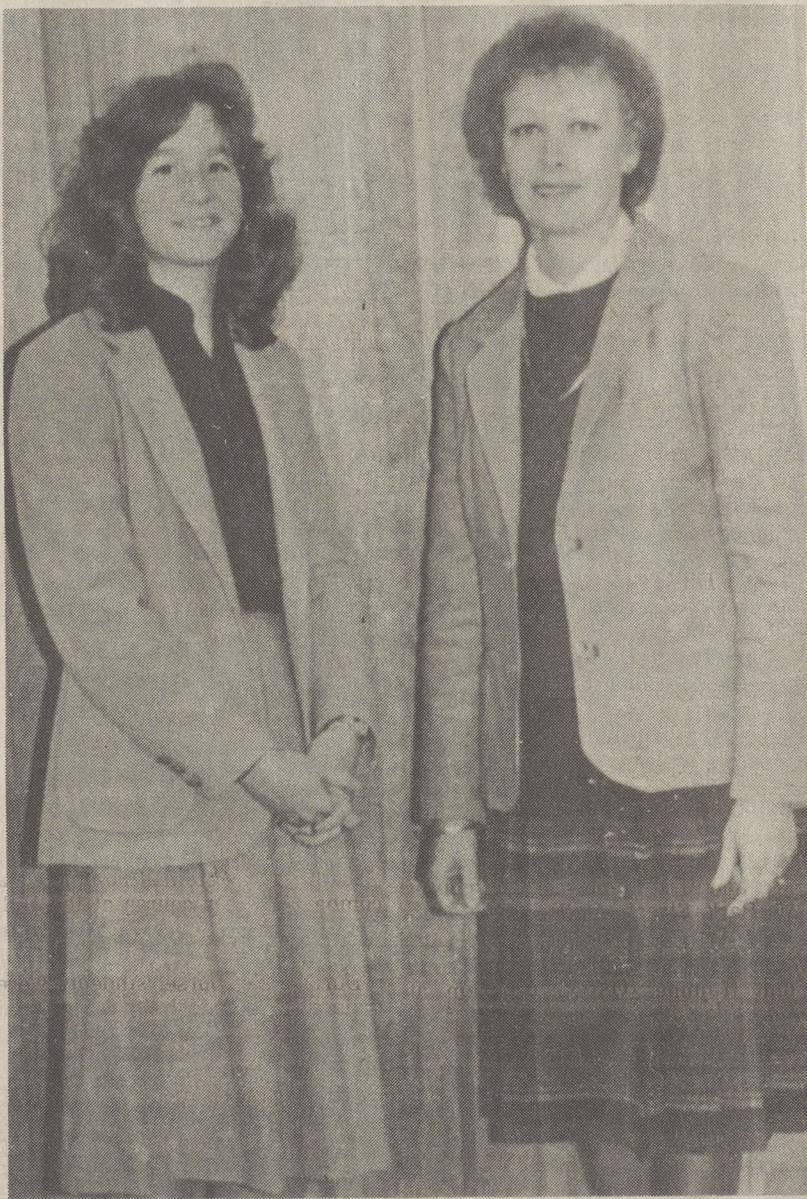
Family Center plans program
