Payment approved

Payment of more than \$75,000 on contracts for a new sewage processing system and a building to house it were approved Nov. 10 by the Dallas Area Municipal Authority

The authority also denied a request by Sterling Construction co. for another \$36,999 for work on the building. It was believed the firm had not completed enough work on the building to justify the payment. The board had originally agreed to pay the firm \$30,000

Schools evacuated

Approximately 2,900 students in the Dallas School District were evacuated from five school buildings on Nov. 8 when a young male caller phoned in a bomb threat.

The call was received at the high school switchboard at 12:13 p.m. but the youth did not say in which school a bomb had been planted.

All schools in the district were then evacuated. No bomb was found, however, and students were allowed to re-enter the school buildings at approximately 1 p.m.

The bomb scare was the second one in the school district this year.

Zoning approved

The Jackson Township Board of Supervisors approved plans for a subdivision of private property near Sutton Road at their meeting Nov.


The subdivision plan calls for the property known as Woodridge to be developed into a residential housing development.
