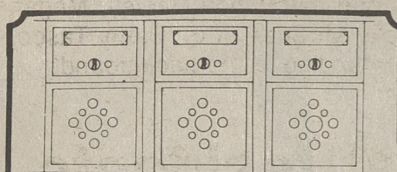

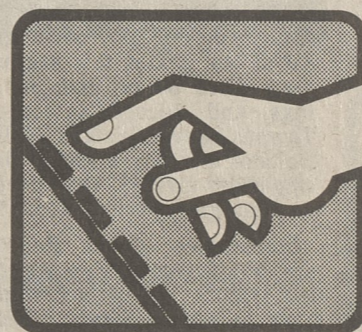

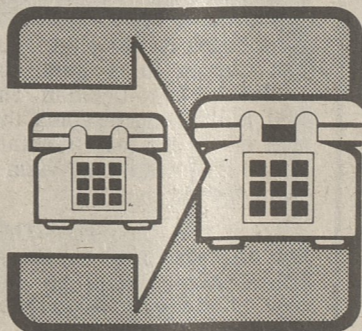
Speed Calling
