New features will benefit 1700 people

Some 1,700 communications customers in Commonwealth Telephone Company's Sweet Valley (477) exchange will benefit from the latest developments in telephone technology when new electronic digital switching equipment is placed in operation during the first quarter of 1984.

The \$475,000 project currently underway involves installation of remote equipment in the Sweet Valley office which will tie into a larger NEAX 61 KAI Central Office located in Dallas.

Four custom calling features will be available options for individual line residence and business customers in Sweet Valley. For an additional monthly charge, customers can take advantage of more personalized telephone service in the form of call waiting, call forwarding, speed calling and three-way calling.

The call waiting feature alerts a customer of an incoming call when he is already on the line. The first party can be placed on hold while the second call can be answered. Customers can alternate back and forth between the two calls. The feature can greatly reduce missed calls due to a busy telephone.

Call forwarding offers the advantage of transferring calls automatically to another local or long distance number. This feature is convenient for a business person who wants to catch after-hours business calls at home or for anyone who doesn't want to miss an important call.

Speed calling is a time-saving feature which allows a customer to call up to eight frequently dialed numbers by dialing a one-digit code. This option can accommodate local and long distance telephone numbers.

With three-way calling a third phone can be added to an established call, turning an everyday two-way telephone call into a three-way conversation.
