**Postmaster offers mailing tips**

In order to help mailers get the best possible service during the Christmas mailing season, Postmaster Thomas P. Bly of Dallas offers these tips for safe, timely delivery of holiday packages:

- Address your package correctly and completely and use the right Zip Code.
- Use a sturdy container such as a

- corrugated box for items of average weight.
- Cushion each item in the container using crumpled or rolled newspapers, plastic chips or plastic or fiberboard inserts.
- Seal your parcel with reinforced filament tape.
- You don't have to use wrapping

paper on boxes; simply cross out old addresses and clearly print the new address on one side of the parcel.

- Ask your Postal clerk about delivery times and prices for Parcel Post, Priority Mail and Express Mail. Then decide which combination of fast delivery and economy best meets your needs.
