PSU prof publishes article

An article by Dr. Frederick J. Stefon, assistant professor of history at the Wilkes-Barre Campus of the Pennsylvania State University in Lehman, appeared in the Fall edition of The Journal of Ethnic Studies.

The article, "The Indians' Zarathustra", investigates the philosophical roots of Indian Commissioner Joe Collier's educational and administrative policies toward the American Indian during the Roosevelt Administration's New Deal. Collier served as Franklin D. Roosevelt's Commissioner of Indian Affairs from 1933 to 1945.

As Commissioner of Indian Affairs, Collier espoused an administrative policy of cultural pluralism for the American Indian and other American minorities.

Dr. Stefon teaches history, American studies and humanities at Penn State Wilkes-Barre. His articles have appeared in The Indian Historian, and he has written reviews for Best Sellers, The Annals, and the Journal of American Ethnic History.

Part II of Stefon's article is scheduled to be published by the Journal of Ethnic Studies in its Winter 1984 issue.
