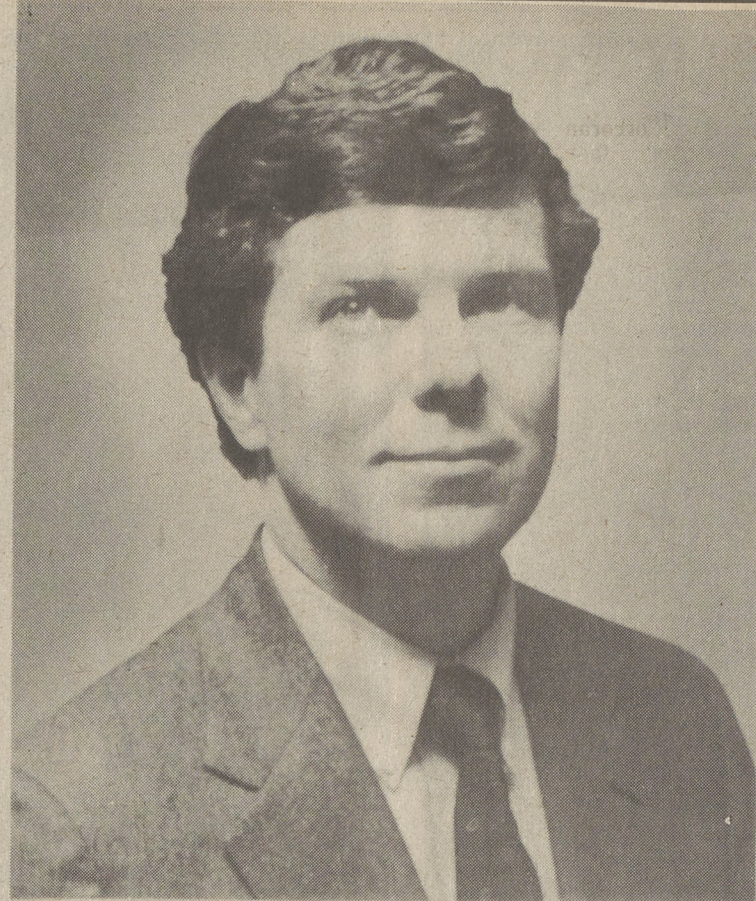

Misericordia official named Keuka head

Arthur F. Kirk, Jr., Ed.D., Vice-President of College Misericordia, Dallas, has been named the 16th president of Keuka College.

Dr. Kirk was elected by Keuka's board of trustees at a meeting on the Keuka campus Saturday, Dec. 10. He assumes his responsibilities Jan. 1, 1984.

Dr. Kirk succeeds Elizabeth Woods Shaw who was appointed president in August 1978 and announced her retirement earlier this year.

A native of New Jersey, Dr. Kirk received his B.A. degree from Newark State College and his M.A. in administration and supervision from Kean College of New Jersey. His Doctor of Education in labor education, awarded by Rutgers University, had as its concentration organizational development and Dr. Kirk studied survival strategies of small colleges.

Dr. Kirk has been vice president of College Misericordia since 1979. During that period, College Misericordia's enrollments grew by over

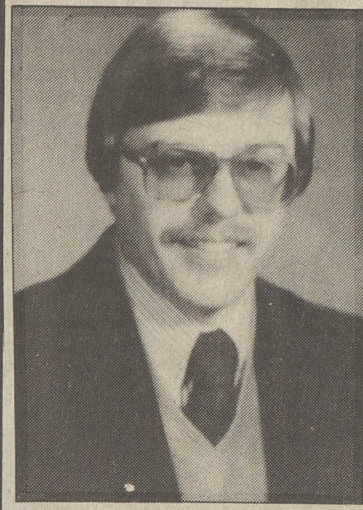
25 percent, annual giving has more than doubled, the college has developed state of the art computer capabilities for academic and management purposes and the college produced operating surpluses annually.

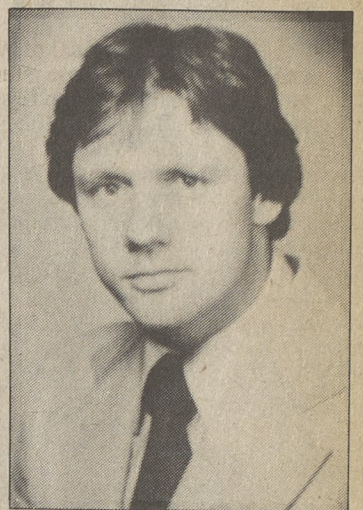

For those individuals who need MAT 105 or any other advanced Algebra and do not have an adequate Algebra background or for those who have been away from school for a number of years and need to brush up on Algebra, this is the recommended course. Students registering for this course should have an adequate background in basic mathematics. It should be also noted that the credits gained through completion of this course cannot be utilized for degree purposes.
