Manusky makes difference

Mountaineers squeak by GAR for first-half crown

Greg Manusky attempted just one shot in Saturday's playoff game between Dallas and GAR for the Wyoming Valley Conference Division II first-half basketball championship, but it was that one shot that

The Mountaineer senior was fouled on his only attempt at the basket and sank the first of two tries from the charity stripe to give the Dallas cagers of coach Clarence Ozgo a 34-33 victory and the first-half

Dallas was unable to score during most of the fourth quarter until Dave Thomas hit a layup with just 51 seconds remaining in that period, pulling the Mountaineers to within one. GAR's Greg Skrepnak then hit one of two foul shots, tying the score at the 20 second mark

to set up Manusky's game-winning foul shot. Neither team was able to score until nearly two minutes had gone by in the opening quarter. Ed Gorey finally found the mark for Dallas with a baseline drive and two short jumpers. GAR battled back with a manto-man press and knotted the score at 10 after one

The Mountaineers, who went scoreless until the 3:30 mark in the second period, ran to a 20-14 halftime advantage behind four points by Thomas. The Mountaineer's leading scorer canned a pair of foul shots and a jumper to give the locals the six-point halfway


