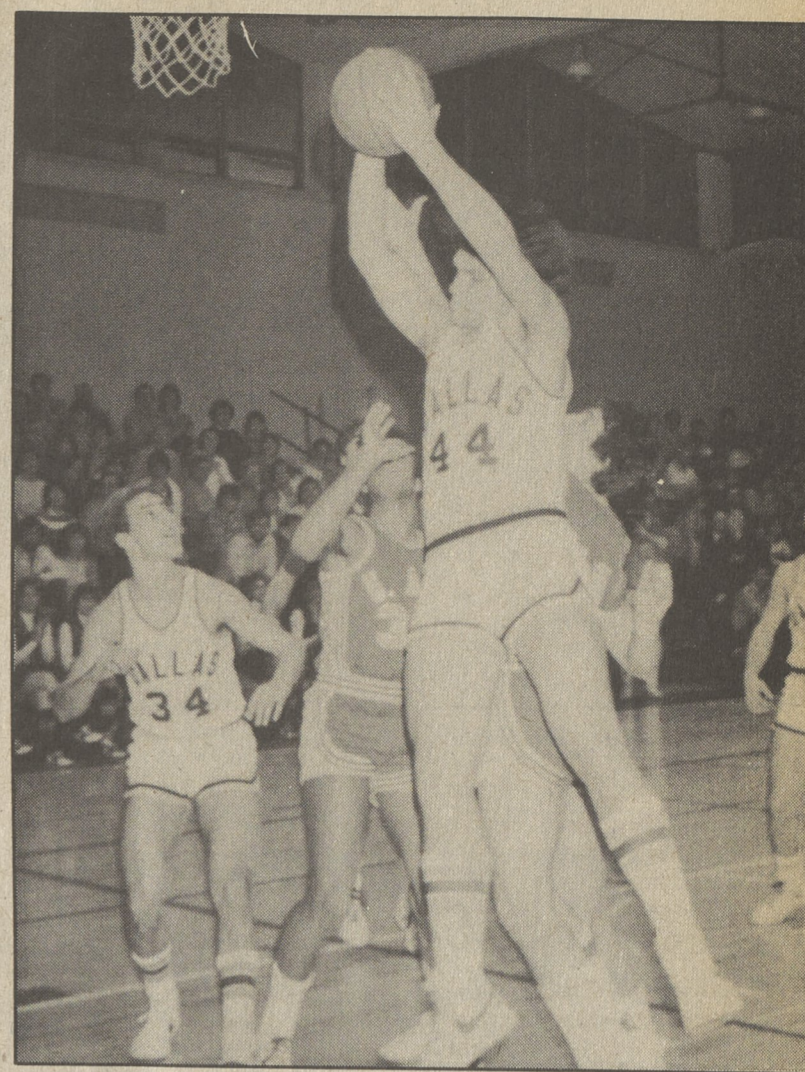
Coughlin, 9-1, remained in a tie for first place with Wyoming Valley West in the Wyoming Valley Wrestling Conference with

Dallas whose record dropped to 6-4 on the season, won decisions at 105, 119, 126 and 155.

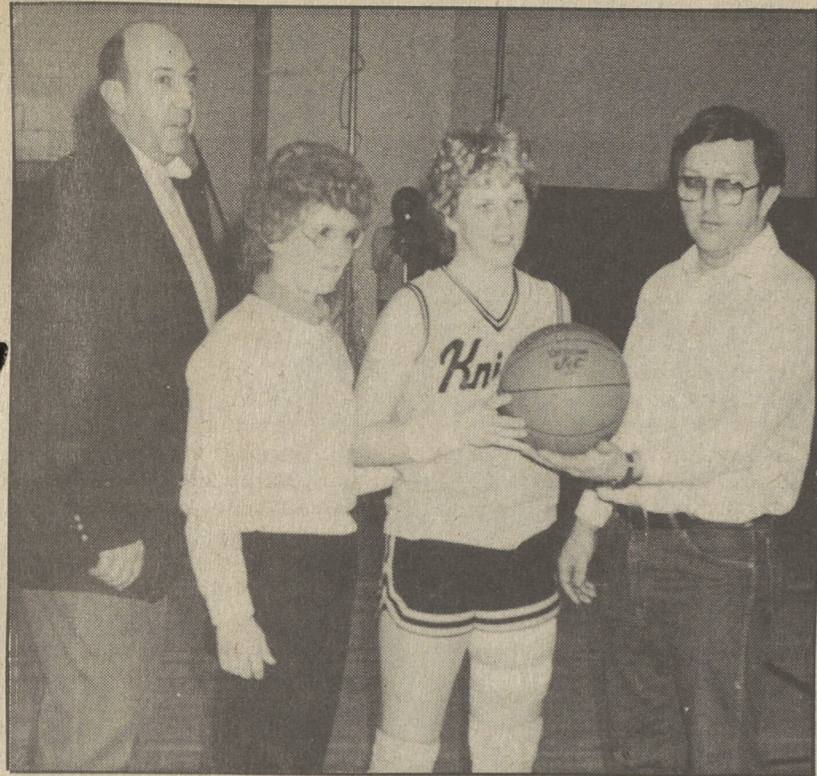

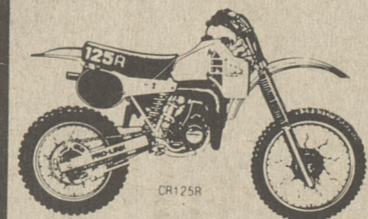
